Joshua Brown was first recognized for his debut performance with the Cleveland Orchestra at the age of fifteen, for which he received glowing reviews from critics including "stunning," "brilliantly played" and "spellbinding." Following that debut, Joshua has gone on to perform with dozens of orchestras both here and abroad, continually garnering praise from critics, has performed at concert halls on three continents, has made multiple appearances on NPR's nationally syndicated program From the Top, and has been featured on WFMT, WNIU, WCLV, ElmhurstTV, Fox5DC, Brazil's Record TV, and Argentina's Radio Nacional Clásica FM 96.7.

Additionally, Joshua, at the age of only nineteen, won the Tenth International Violin Competition of Leopold Mozart in Augsburg, Germany, securing the First Prize, "Mozart" Prize, the Audience Award, the Chairman of the Jury Special Prize, the Kronberg Academy Special Prize, and the CD Production Special Prize. Other competition victories include the Cooper International Violin Competition (Second Prize and the Audience Award) and the IX International Tchaikovsky Competition for Young Musicians held in Novosibirsk, Russia (the Audience Award, Special Prize, the Academy of Arts Golden Medal, and the Siberian Academy of Arts Talent Award). Joshua was also a top prize winner in the 2016 Stradivarius International Competition; was awarded the Grand Prize for Violin in the ENKOR International Competition; was a National YoungArts Winner for two consecutive years; was named a 2018 Yamaha Young Performing Artist; and was awarded the Luminarts Cultural Foundation's 2019 Fellowship for Strings. Additionally, as part of Kairos String Quartet, Joshua won Gold Medals in both the Junior Division of the 2018 Fischhoff National Chamber Competition and the Junior String Division of the 2018 M-Prize International Chamber Arts Competition, making Kairos the only chamber group ever to win the top prizes at both Fischhoff and M-Prize.

A recipient of the Stradivari Society of Chicago, Joshua is extremely grateful to be playing on a 1679 Pietro Guarneri violin from Cremona. He currently studies violin with Donald Weilerstein at New England Conservatory of Music (NEC), where he has been awarded a full merit Scholarship as the recipient of the Friedlaender Family Presidential Scholarship.

For the five years prior to NEC, Joshua studied with Almita and Roland Vamos at the Music Institute of Chicago's (MIC) Academy as a Scholarship Fellow (recipient of both the Rachel Barton Pine Scholarship and the Alexandra C. and John D. Nichols Fellowship). Other scholarships include the North Shore Chamber Music Festival's Haag/Galvin Young Artist and Arkady Fomin Scholarship, the American Opera Society of Chicago's Eleanor Pearce Sherwin Scholarship, the Highland Park Music Club Scholarship, the Parkridge Civic Orchestra's International Rotary Scholarship, and the 2019 Luminarts Cultural Foundation at the Union League Club of Chicago Classical Strings Fellowship.
